From the
Pastor's Desk

## New Wineskins

The New Year is often a good time for cleaning out closets and intentionally trying to reduce clutter in our lives. What spiritual "cleaning out" do you need to do as this new year unfolds? What clutter (physical, emotional or mental) is in your way? Do you need to let go of the old to make room for the new?
In Luke 5, Jesus told a parable: "No one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise the new wine will burst the skins and will be spilled, and the skins will be destroyed. ${ }^{38}$ But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. ${ }^{39}$ And no one after drinking old wine desires new wine, but says, 'The old is good.'"

I'm not a sommelier, but I know that some wines are better with age. The right aging process also helps the flavor of certain types of cheeses and even home-made spaghetti sauce \& chili. As followers of a faith that started over 2,000 years ago (and one that was rooted in an even more ancient faith) we know that OLD STUFF can be GOOD! But, sometimes, we need NEW ways of living out our sharing of the "Old, old story" so that others can hear it anew and our own hearts can be refreshed.

Let me tell you about some NEW things happening in one of the "oldest" groups at FCC...
CWF - Christian Women's Fellowship - has been active in our congregation since FCC's inception in 1921 (though initially the group was called the Women's Missionary Society). In fact, it was a group of women meeting in a home in Casper who first decided that our community NEEDED this church! They invited the evangelist Rev. Charles Stout to come and preach. (Check out his photo on our hallway history of ministers.) The women of the church continue to ask: what does FCC need? What needs in Casper can we help meet? Now, they are trying to figure out the right "container" for a beloved ministry of this church.

When Rev. See was preaching here, and we had over 400 members, there were at least five CWF circles. Through the years, as membership declined, CWF consolidated into three groups. After my arrival here nine-plus years ago, we added a new group "Godly Girlfriends" meeting at night to accommodate younger, working women's schedules. Though CWF's membership is much smaller, the three women's circles and Godly Girlfriends continue to do tremendous ministry - faithfully funding special projects both inside the church and meeting needs in Natrona County, hosting bereavement receptions, providing the Sunday coffee hour once a month, helping monthly with the sandwich ministry, baking goodies for the Pumpkin Patch, sending cards to homebound members, and more.

Among the changes coming for CWF: Consideration of using new initials: DWM - meaning Disciples Women's Ministry in an attempt to be more inclusive \& welcoming of ALL women in the church, even those who've never connected with CWF - and restructuring their Executive Board. Rather than meeting monthly, they plan to coordinate activities of their circle groups in less formal ways and plan a larger quarterly event to include more women of the church \& their families. Thanks to Peg Jackson and her helper Harriet Ames for encouraging the women to try doing things in a new way.

The first such new event will be a Spaghetti Dinner on Friday, Feb. 15. Mark your calendars now for this FREE meal and night of romantic music with FREE childcare, all provided by CWF/DWM in Fellowship Hall. (See elsewhere in The Call for more details.)

## UPDATE FROM THE MISSION COMMISSION

The Mission Commission and the youth will work together for the Souper Bowl of Caring on February 3rd. The Fleece Blanket ministry has made 967 blankets since the project was started and has delivered over 920 blankets to date. We will be making blankets on January 26th from 1-4 p.m. (not our regular scheduled Saturday) to try to reach the goal of making 1000 blankets by our 3rd year anniversary! The Mission Commission gives blankets to people in need and to 28 organizations that serve those in need.
