Clarence Edward Grooms was born September 8, 1929. He was drafted from Valentine, Nebraska in 1950 into the Army and served in the infantry. He served on the front lines in Korea for $10-\mathrm{s} / 2$ months. He was promoted to Sgt. First Class three different times. Ed was not afraid to speak the truth to power and "power" didn't always like it. He was fortunate to be one of 13 from his company of 256 servicemen that returned alive.
