Dear Church Family,

As of this writing I am entering my 4th year as pastor of FCC. I have preached about 324 times (twice a Sunday - 8:15 am, 10:10 am Worship Services and several times at Primrose- 2nd Sunday of the month). Do you remember all of my sermons? Are they seared into your soul? Probably not right? Someone said that church is of no value to them because they don't remember any of the sermons they heard. What do you think about that observation? Is church worship of no value because we don't remember the sermon, the songs sung, the special music or choir songs sung? Or the communion we took? Or the people we have conversations and connect with? I ask you, how many meals do you remember in the last week, month or year? Do you know what you ate for dinner three weeks ago? If you are like me the answer to that question is "no." But does that mean I didn't benefit from those meals that are unremembered? The answer to that question is also "no." I have received nutrition from all those meals and they linger with me to this day (I would like a little less lingering, but Oh well!). Our church interactions with sermons, songs, prayers and fellowship add to our lives. That is how we live and breathe and have our being. Do we remember all of it? Probably not, but the benefit remains. Please remember that when you think about not coming to church because it isn't perfect, or I don't like this or that song, or I don't remember everything that happens or is said - we are the sum of that experience and it benefits us all! Enough said. Here are a few other things I would like to share with you that are happening this month in the life or our church:

We will be celebrating a "Trunk or Treat" on the Sunday, October 27th, before Halloween where we will invite all of First Christian Church Pre-school families as well as the families in our church - no age limit to participate - you will decorate your car or truck trunk or bed and hand out candy and treats that you supply. We will have hot beverages and snacks in Fellowship Hall. We will begin this at 2 PM and run 4 PM. More information is in a special article in this Call. Hope you all can come and celebrate and share in good times for the whole family.

I would like to have you ponder this two part question in the coming days: What is your hope for FCC in the coming days as we strive to embrace our future and What am I willing to sacrifice in my time, treasure and talent to see the work of Christ shared among our church family as well as in Casper and beyond?

The elders are in the beginning stages of putting together a search committee for an Associate Minister. If you would like to be on this committee you can contact Nancy Thomas or Dennis Baker. The following is what I said to the Board in my Pastor's Board Report for our September Board Meeting: The Elders have met and discussed it and have directed Nancy Thomas, Elder Chair to bring a motion to the Board for vote. FCC has used the Interim Minister approach several times in the past with mixed reviews. There is also a model called "Succession." It is where you hire an Associate Minister who has a job description that is very loosely specific and over time takes on more Lead Pastor responsibilities. Succession models usually are around a year to two years in length. Through the generosity and foresight of several long time past and present members we have a fund for an Associate Minister position. It will help with the ease of transition for the church both financially and spiritual leadership as well. If you are interested in being on an Associate Minister Search team please see me or our Board Leadership.

October is our Stewardship Month where we prayerfully consider our financial gifts, tithes and offerings to our church. On Sunday, October 6th I will be preaching a Stewardship message entitled: Commitment to the Call of God - Giving, it will explore the themes of calling, commitment, and stewardship through the lens of Matthew 16:16-18 and Mark 12:14-17. In the Gospel of Matthew, Peter's confession of Jesus as the Christ reveals his direct, unfiltered connection to God's call, symbolizing the importance of listening to and accepting God's call in our lives. In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus deftly handles a trap about taxes, reminding us to give to Caesar (for us it would be Federal Taxes and fees) what is Caesar's and to God what is God's. The message challenges us to reflect on our own lives: are we giving to God what truly belongs to Him—our time, talents, and treasure? As an aside you may also know that our giving as a congregation over the past several years has fallen short of meeting our obligations to this ministry by some 35 percent? If it wasn't for the giving of saints from our churches past in the form of wills, trusts and endowments, we would be looking at serious cuts in our budget. Please consider that when you receive your stewardship pledge card.

Through these passages, the call is for a deep, lasting commitment to God, urging us to offer our whole selves to His service, knowing that true giving is eternal and never depleted. To this end, I strive to be a servant of God while I serve FCC as Lead Pastor. May we all strive to be good stewards of God's blessings in our lives as we share in this vital work of ministry.




ATTENTION ALL CHURCH MEMBERS




