



The Mission Commission brainstorms and organizes projects for First Christian Church to support. We include some joint projects with DWM, which gives us more mission ideas to consider. Any opportunity we have as a whole congregation to help people in our community and beyond is part of the mission of our church. While we support several organizations with financial assistance through the budget, our active "hands-on" ministries give all members of our congregation a variety of opportunities to volunteer a few hours of time each month.

The Sandwich Ministry, organized by Debbie Mestas, is our most active ministry. Sandwiches are made every Friday (3 people for an hour) and 75 lunches are packed every Saturday (3-4 people for an hour). The lunches are delivered to the Methodist Church where they are distributed. Three other church groups take part on certain weekends—Good Shepherd, Sovereign Grace, and LDS.

The Blanket Ministry, organized by Trudy Woodard, meets on the third Saturday of each month except in the summer. The blankets are made of fleece and knotted around the edges—easy and quick to do. These fleece blankets are given to cancer and dialysis patients undergoing lengthy treatments, to the youth crisis center, and to individuals who may benefit from a soft, cozy wrap of love and care. This is a very satisfying project for a few hours on one Saturday a month. And they make a difference to the recipients: "My husband received your luxurious, soft and warm blanket at his first dialysis session. It was such a wonderful, human, loving touch on such a profoundly anxious and life-changing day."

Another hands-on ministry is serving a meal at the Rescue Mission on the fourth Friday of the month. We do not provide the meal, but help with last minute preparation and then serve the food to the individuals present. This involves 3-4 volunteers for about two hours once a month. Anyone can volunteer! To learn more or give of your time, contact Debbie, Trudy, or Nancy Thomas.

As we begin our **fourth** year of DWM, I would like to share with you the **giving spirit** of the women in our group. We have no "dues," so their generosity is from the heart. In 2024 members contributed \$1,460.00 to the DWM budget along with \$284.00 from their Blessing Jars for a total of \$1743.00. While the majority of the profit from the sale of our cookbooks arrived in 2023, we also received \$511.00 in 2024, thanks to the congregation's support of the project.

From our 2024 budget we gave \$500 to the Rescue Mission and Seton House. Seton House also received \$200.00 for winter clothing, in particular, for good winter coats for ladies returning to work. The Preschool received \$1000.00 in January of 2024 which we had allotted in 2023.

During the year we have a different service project every month. Monetary donations from the women were given to the Olivia Caldwell Foundation of \$140.00 and to The Heifer Foundation of \$130.00. Both organizations matched these amounts.

We provided wrapped candy to the Rescue Mission for Valentine's Day, gold coins to our congregation for St. Patrick's Day, and "stocking stuffers" to help Heart to Hands fill 100 Christmas stockings for Casper's children. In December we gave monetary gifts to our FCC staff. Both Interfaith and Hospice received material goods during the year.. During the three summer months, those who were able stayed after our meetings to help make blankets for the Blanket Ministry.

We had our annual potluck dinners, one in the summer and one in December to celebrate Christmas. A fun project this year was the creation of a very large Christmas card for all DWM members. Their individual pictures were surrounded by a Christmas frame, along with their memory of belonging to this church or to DWM/CWF.

The most important thing you need to know about our DWM women is that we care about each other. At every meeting we share joys and concerns. Friendships are made and bonds are formed. We care about reading the Bible and we are being challenged to read it daily with the goal of finishing it by December 31, 2025. We care about our church, our Casper community, and the rest of the world.

Join us on the second Tuesday of each month in Fellowship Hall at 1:00 p.m. And remember, "Every day, we need each other still. Pass this on to all the other women who make your life
