Dear Church Family,

As I write this, Teresa and I are looking forward to spending the day after Christmas with our son, daughter, son-in-law, and most importantly, our three granddaughters. This will be a truly special time, as it's been several years

since we were able to celebrate Christmas together. While it's not on Christmas Day, it will be Christmas in our hearts. And here's some exciting news: for the second time, our daughter has mentioned they may come out to visit in the summer! But, that was said last year and with young families life seems to happen in rapid and every changing speed.

Life changes as the years pass. It used to be that our children came and went pretty much at our will—but as they've grown, their lives have become increasingly full and separate from ours. And since we all only have so much time on this earth, it is vital that we spend it building up those around us. That will be my goal in the coming years, to use my time to the fullest that I can.

As we step into a new year, many of us carry hopeful resolutions: to lose weight, develop better habits, or spend more time with family. But, if we're honest, those exercise bikes in the corner (or in my case a rowing machine) may still serve as makeshift coat racks, and our habits often revert to what they were. Even our time with family can devolve into texts and emails. (By the way, that's how my kids send me birthday wishes—not that I'm complaining! But wouldn't it be nice to get a phone call, a visit, or even a handwritten note in the mail?)

This past year has taught me a few things: life is precious, time with loved ones is invaluable, and time with God is what sustains me and keeps me moving forward. So, as we begin a new year, I wonder: What have you learned from this past year that you want to carry into 2025? **Bryan**




CHRISTIAN EDUCATION does not have any activities scheduled for the month January.
